In 2013, Californians recycled an average of 49,863,014 beverage containers each day, totaling 18.2 billion beverage containers for the year.

This saved the equivalent of 5.3 million barrels of oil and reduced the equivalent of 1.7 million metric tons of carbon dioxide in greenhouse gas emissions, which equates to eliminating the energy consumption of more than 276,000 households for one year.*
